Located on the 42nd parallel, Leamington shares the same latitude as northern California. Our winters are probably the mildest in the country and our summers are long and lingering. Lakeside breezes moderate our weather year round.

The Leamington Kinsmen Recreation Complex is a modern fitness centre featuring an Olympic size pool, multi purpose gymnasium, squash and racquetball courts, fitness studio, indoor track, two ice surfaces and more. Essex County is home to many fine golf courses with Erie Shores Golf and County Club ranked as one of the best. Outdoor enthusiasts will enjoy a variety of natural areas including world renowned birding hot-spots like Point Pelee National Park, Kopegaron Woods and Hillman Marsh. Our newly developed network of walking trails is ever expanding and is connected with the Chrysler Canada Greenway. The Leamington Municipal Marina is one of the finest on the Great Lakes and has ample resident and transient slips available. The marina hosts a number of events throughout the spring and summer months including open-air concerts and arts and craft shows. The marina promenade is a great place to walk along the shore line while enjoying a beautiful park setting.

Home to some of the most fertile soils on the continent and coupled with the mild temperature, Leamington has one of the longest growing seasons in the country. The area is blessed with a tremendous variety of fresh fruits and vegetables. Everything from apples to zucchini can be found at one of the many fruit and vegetable stands that dot the roadsides. In fact, it's been said that if it doesn't grow in Leamington in can't be grown in Canada!

Leamington is not just famous for its field produce...we are also home to the largest concentration of greenhouses in North America. This multi billion dollar industry focuses mainly on

growing peppers, a wide variety of tomatoes, and cucumbers. Over 75% of the greenhouse crop is exported to the United States. No other place in Canada can you enjoy a virtually year round supply of locally grown fresh produce.

In Leamington you can relax in the tranquility of a small town while not missing out on all the entertainment options available in a larger metropolitan area. In less than one hour you can be in Windsor or Detroit where you can take in a major sporting event, visit internationally acclaimed galleries and museums, take in a concert or spend some time at a casino. Both Windsor and Detroit have air and train service making it easy to travel to and from our area. Leamington is also less than two hours from London, and Toronto is a short 3.5 hour drive.
